Helensburgh & Lomond Carers SCIO	Argyll and Bute	£192,783	This group will use the funding to continue their Connecting Young Carers Programme which provides one to one support, group work activities, information and advice, and crisis support to young carers within the Helensburgh and Lomond area. Funding will enable them to support 190 young carers, with 23 people volunteering.
Rosyth Community Projects Limited / EATSRosyth	Fife	£90,000	This group will use the funding to consolidate the food and gardening-themed community base they have established in their initial one-and-a-half years of operation. This will enable them to continue to maintain their community garden, a large community orchard, public floral displays and small, and scattered plots. They will also be able to continue producing and freely distributing a large amount of their own crops in partnership with local food retailers.
Epilepsy Scotland	Glasgow City	£146,439	This organisation will develop a self-management programme designed to reduce loneliness and isolation to help improve the mental health of people who maybe struggling with life due to their epileptic seizures. Individuals aged 18 and over will be able to access a number of activities including' 1:1 counselling, breathing and relaxation exercises, and peer support. They will also run training sessions for family members.
Govan Community Project	Glasgow City	£147,454	This group works to bring together the community in Govan, Craigton and Cardonald through a range of community activities including male only, female only and mixed social groups. Other activities include an asylum advice and advocacy service; English language classes; food distribution; and a homework club. The funding will be used to continue running these activities.
Scottish Sports Futures	Glasgow City	£141,605	This group will use the funding to deliver its Active East programme for young people aged between 16–24 years old who are disengaged from education, employment or training. The programme will use physical activity as a hook to get young people involved in youth work, sport and community activity in Glasgow's East End. They will then support the young people in achieving life goals and reaching positive destinations.
SEMDC SCIO	Glasgow City	£149,980	This funding will be used to support the Club's activities which include; 1:1 support, social activities, workshops, drop-ins, events, outings and bi-weekly meetings. The club provides these services to adults from the deaf ethnic minority community to help increase confidence and independence. The programme will be centred around the needs of the people involved and will include activities such as dance and holistic therapies.

St Matthew's Centre	Glasgow City	£146,712	This centre will expand its operations and employ a full time Centre Manager to support them to become a more vibrant, user led, inclusive hub and a strongly connected community asset. The project will focus on a range of themes around Getting Active; Getting Well; Being Connected; and Being Informed. There will also be minor improvements to existing spaces within the centre, and a kitchen upgrade to encourage family focussed activities in cooking and eating well.
The Senior Centre Castlemilk	Glasgow City	£243,500	This group will use the funding to provide services for older people activity targeting people aged 55 years and over from Castlemilk and the surrounding areas. They will employ an administrator, café assistant and a driver/janitor to ensure members have complete access to their Centre which helps to reduce isolation and loneliness. They will do this by providing a varied range of activities from within the Centre and throughout the community.
Toonspeak Young People's Theatre	Glasgow City	£118,800	This group is a leader in creative youth empowerment, delivering a wide range of arts based activities to develop young people from disadvantaged backgrounds. The funding will be used for the My Way programme which takes referrals from partner organisations working with highly vulnerable young people in North Glasgow. They will create a new Outreach and Partnership role, and increase current staff capacity to give young people better access to workshops, master-classes and performance opportunities.
Newmains Community Trust Ltd	North Lanarkshire	£100,000	This group will use the funding to employ a programme manager and centre manager to expand and enhance the range and delivery of activities run from the centre for the people of Newmains. The funding will also be used for the delivery of a community support programme focussing on the three areas of health and wellbeing; employability, equality and diversity.
North Lanarkshire Women's Aid Limited	North Lanarkshire	£125,583	This grant will be used to develop a dedicated children and young person's service supporting children and young people who have experienced the effects of domestic abuse. The project will deliver high quality child centred 1-to-1 sessions, group support and play therapy as well as providing a group work programme around domestic abuse and other identified themes. This will help the children and young people cope with the effects of trauma whilst providing an increased sense of confidence and self-esteem.
Viewpark Gardens Allotments Association	North Lanarkshire	£78,503	This group will use the funding to create a number of new allotment beds for members of the community to come and give gardening a try. A kitchen will also be installed and the funding will also allow accessibility improvements to be made to the site and a project worker will be recruited to support the day to day running of the organisation.
Re-Tweed	Scottish Borders	£60,000	This group will deliver a textiles upcycling workshop programme for women experiencing acute isolation and loneliness. The women will learn a range of sewing and upcycling skills in craft design and technology. They will then create a range of fashions, furnishings and craft items which will be sold locally.
Bannockburn House Trust	Stirling	£150,000	This group will use the funding to establish a new post of Volunteer Co-Ordinator within the organisation. This will enable the Trust to build capacity as it works to develop the grade A listed 17th century mansionhouse and 25 acres of surrounding land they have just acquired. This will be done to benefit the community of Bannockburn who will be able to use the site as a base or a broad range of community activities, projects and events.
